MONDAY MAY 28

- **2:00pm** Faculty members check-in at Trinity College, Broad Street, Oxford and check-in to accommodation in a new building, designed for conference delegates. Please note If you arrive before 2pm, please go to Chester House and leave your bags at the OSAP Reception on the top floor.
- **3:00pm** An Introduction to English Architecture in Oxford in the Dansun room, Trinity College, Dr. Ed Clarke, Tutor in English Literature, Art and Art History, St Catherine's College. The lecture will be followed by a walking tour of Oxford, please wear comfortable shoes.
- **6:00pm Welcome Reception** in the Situ Room, Trinity College, where you will meet your fellow participants and the OSAP staff and some Oxford dons.
- **7.15pm Dinner in the Trinity College Dining Hall**, followed by drinks in a nearby pub at participants' expense.

TUESDAY MAY 29

Lectures this morning are in Lecture Room 6, New College

- **9:00am** Meet at the Trinity College Porter's Lodge to walk in a group to New College, Holywell Street.
- 9:15am An Introduction to the Oxford Academic System, Professor Robert Schuettinger, OSAP Director, former Visiting Research Fellow in International Relations, MC, Oxford University, Associate Fellow, Yale University (1975 present), Associate member of the Senior Common Room, Christ Church College.
- **11:00am** The Oxford Tutorial, David Palfreyman, Fellow and Bursar, New College. Mr. Palfreyman has written eight books on higher education in Britain and America, including "The Oxford Tutorial: Thanks for Teaching Me How to Think." See: http://oxcheps.new.ox.ac.uk/

- **12:15pm** Working lunch with David Palfreyman, Dr. Tudor Jones (Politics) and Dr. John Dowling (Economics) in the New College Dining Hall. Participants can discuss the Oxford Tutorial system.
- 1:30pm Meet at the New College Porter's Lodge to walk in a group from Trinity College to Gloucester Green Bus Station to catch the 1:55pm S3 bus to Woodstock. You will be issued with a return ticket, please keep this safe as you will need it to return to Oxford. You should arrive in Woodstock outside the Marlborough Arms at about 2:25pm. Lunch in Woodstock at participants' expense.
- 2:30pm Meet outside of the gates to Blenheim Palace for a guided tour of the home of the Duke of Marlborough, the head of the Churchill family and the birthplace of Winston Churchill. After the tour, please feel free to explore the grounds and the town of Woodstock. You can catch the S3 bus back to Oxford from opposite the palace gates or from Woodstock, outside of the Marlborough Arms. You are free to return to Oxford at your leisure.

WEDNESDAY MAY 30

- **10:00am** Meet at the Trinity Porter's Lodge to walk in a group to the OSAP Office (the top floor of Chester House, 21-27 George Street). Brief tour of the OSAP Office.
- **10:30am** The OSAP Academic Program for Visiting Students and Associate Members, Robert Schuettinger
- **11:00am** Oxford University from the Second World War to 2010, Mr G. H. L. Le May, Emeritus Fellow in History, former Dean of Worcester College, Oxford (Mr Le May worked directly for Prime Minister Churchill as a speechwriter during WWII).
- 12:15pm Lunch in the Trinity College Dining Hall.
- **1:30pm** Meet at the Trinity College Porter's Lodge to walk in a group to Oxford University Press (OUP), Walton Street, Jericho.
- **1:45pm** Arrive at OUP. There will be a presentation about the Oxford English Dictionary, followed by a tour of the OUP museum.
- **4:30pm** Walking tour of student housing in Jericho, St. Giles and St. Michaels Street. Brian Murray will lead the group from OUP to 11A Little Clarendon Street, 37 St. Giles (an 18th Century Annex of Christ Church) and 10 St. Michaels Street, pointing out areas of Jericho along the way.
- **5:30pm** Meet at the Trinity College Gates on Broad Street to walk to Christ Church for Sung Eucharist (if you miss the group, meet outside the Christ Church Porter's Lodge on St. Aldate's at 5:45pm).
 - **Participants will have dinner on their own this evening, according to their own choice of restaurant. Some may wish to see a play.

THURSDAY MAY 31

9:30am Meet in front of the Trinity College Gates on Broad Street for a bus tour of Stonehenge, Salisbury and Avebury with Cotswold Roaming. Coach departs at 9:45am sharp.

We travel over the beautiful Berkshire and Wiltshire Downs past the hill fort of Old Sarum, site of one of Britain's oldest settlements, to the city of Salisbury. Nearby at Salisbury Cathedral you can see an original copy of the Magna Carta and admire the tallest spire in Britain (2 hours, 20 minutes in Salisbury). Cotswold Roaming will pay for admission to Stonehenge and Salisbury Cathedral. You will be given free time to purchase lunch in town at participants' expense.

After lunch we travel up the Avon valley to Stonehenge, the most mysterious and enigmatic of all monuments (55 minutes stop). Moving deeper into Ancient Britain, we pass a chalk hill figure and the

West Kennet Long Barrow, a burial chamber dating back 5,500 years. The tour continues to Avebury, Britain's largest stone circle (40 minutes stop), before the return to Oxford via the Vale of the White Horse. Return to Oxford by about 6:00pm.

7.05pm Farewell formal dinner in the Trinity College Dining Hall, followed by drinks in the college beer cellar.

FRIDAY JUNE 1

Dr. Dowling will discuss how he teaches some business courses from a very historical viewpoint.
